Upon Further Reflection

On the Threshold of Something New?

Spring is a transitional season. It delights us with signs of transformation and opportunity as we move from winter to summer. But spring is also a time of bewildering weather: Snow in March? Ice in April? Dark clouds and rain? Ah – here comes the sun!

This mix of goodness, difficulty, and wondering makes springtime a mixed bag. These qualities also describe times of transition in other parts of our lives. When we move from one situation to another, we always pass through a threshold where we are neither fully in the previous situation nor fully in the new one. Sometimes these threshold periods are brief – just a matter of days or weeks. But when we go through big changes the transition time can be months or years.

You can likely identify some changes in your personal life that have taken some time to accommodate and understand.

The Covid-19 pandemic introduced big changes into our world. That came on top of turbulent political rhetoric, increasing climate change, and near constant technological changes (which now includes artificial intelligence). All of these factors accelerated changes in the church that impact church attendance, identity, public perception, and finances. Many keen observers believe the confluence of these factors has brought both society and the church to the threshold of a new epoch.

In her book, *How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going,* Susan Beaumont reflects on the new epoch that is on the way. She writes, "Some new ways are emerging, but we do not yet know what the new world order will be. We are surrounded by prophetic voices trying to point a way forward, but it is not yet clear which pathways we should follow and which we should be wary of."

Times like this are tiring and full of challenges. At the same time, they present opportunities to let go of things that have stopped working and experiment with new ideas for community, ministry, and mission. Over the next few months I will explore more of what Beaumont has to say about how to make the most of these times of transition. Fortunately, for all that changes, much also remains the same. So make bouquets of tulips, look for rainbows, breathe the sweet air, and stomp around in the rain during this Spring season. Change can be beautiful.

Our Connectional Worship is on the 4th Sunday of the month.





There are three ways to share:






