Upon Further Reflection

Setting our sights

What are you setting your sights on in 2024? What goals or hopes do you have?

A recent Forbes Health/OnePoll survey found that 62% of people feel pressured to set a new year's resolution. About half focus on physical fitness while over a third aim at improving mental health. But 66% of people making resolutions say they have already flamed out by April. A grand total of only 6% become lasting habits into the next year. Yikes!

Why do so few resolutions become part of how we live? I think it can be tempting to hope that we can flip a switch and change how we live. The resolutions that flame out may have wonderful intentions, but they often lack sustainable practices that are connected to our sense of self. They also frequently focus on who we're *not* instead of who we *already are*.

And who are we? As Christians our identity emerges from knowing that we are God's beloved children. If we know that we are loved and understand God's goals for our lives, then life changes can be rooted in those things through practical, sustainable steps.

The prayer of Paul in Ephesians chapter 1 is helpful for me in this regard: *"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe."*

This enlightenment of our heart (our true self) results in connecting with God's hope, God's people, and God's power. It's a promise that whatever hard realities we are struggling through, we are able to connect with the things that are eternal, and discern the hype that is passing.

Being rooted in God's hope will move us toward growth and maturity. It can be helpful to be intentional about this growth, as long as we don't think our standing with God or personal happiness are dependent upon our success. Please remember the hope God gives you as a person worthy of love as you set your sights on 2024.


Easter is a movable feast and this year it will be March 31. Palm Sunday is March 24, and Good Friday is March 29. Mark your calendars so you're not surprised.

<u>Numbered Items</u> #1s <u>CLEAR ONLY</u> (<u>NO COLOR</u>) #2s, #4s, #5s, or #6s bagged separately.

NO Styrofoam, compostable items, or curbside recycling items will be accepted.

A Heads-up from the Mission Ministry Team

Have you noticed the five Peace Poles around town in McMinnville? The Peace Pole tradition originated in Japan in response to the bombing of Hiroshima in World War II. Today, there are thousands of Peace Poles across the globe, each baring a universal prayer for world peace in multiple languages. The installation of a peace pole is an internationally recognized symbol of the hopes and dreams of the human family, standing in silent prayer for peace on earth.

This month, thanks to our peacemaking fund, FPC will install McMinnville's sixth Peace Pole, located between the Labyrinth and the parking area west of the church. Weather permitting, we are planning a brief dedication ceremony following worship on February 25th. We will invite indigenous people from the area and fellow faith and civic communities to join members of our congregation for this special event.


