Upon Further Reflection

Contemplation over Compulsion

There is much in our world that pulls us toward compulsive thinking and behavior. From what we eat and what we drink to entertainment to buying "stuff" to scrolling through news or social media online, we are encouraged to simply react to our feelings and satisfy every impulse as soon as we can. When I get stuck in the rut of acting compulsively, it feels like I've lost control of directing my attention and energy in the ways that I would like.

In earlier eras of my life, I tried to respond to this feeling by being more disciplined, setting goals, and making rules. Those things can be helpful but usually fail to address the root issue. It's hard to change our routines and habits if we don't have inner resources to support that change. I now believe the antidote to compulsion is contemplation.

One of the people I've learned about contemplation from is Father Richard Rohr, who founded the Center for Action and Contemplation:

"The contemplative mind is about receiving and being present to the moment, to the now, without judgment, analysis, or critique. Contemplative 'knowing' is a much more holistic, heart-centered knowing, where mind, heart, soul, and senses are open and receptive to the moment just as it is. Contemplative prayer is a practice for a lifetime, never perfected yet always enough."

Embracing this perspective offers us spiritual resources to draw on during our daily life. This month we are beginning a new service called "Deep River Contemplative Worship." This simple service will emphasize various contemplative practices that we can take into our own lives.

When we slow down, open ourselves to the presence of God, and receive what God has for us in that moment, we can find renewal, peace, and love. These are the things we need most and which the world needs most. If you feel the call to be more contemplative, I hope to see you there.

On the afternoon of Monday, March 18th the Earth Care Committee is inviting all members of the congregation to join them for a visit to Eloheh Farm, 6033 NW Lilac Hill Rd, Yamhill. The visit will be from 1:00 PM to 3:30 PM. Meet at the church office parking lot, if you wish to carpool, at 12:15 PM to depart at 12:30 PM for the farm.

Dr. Randy Woodley and his wife, Edith, live on the farm. Randy is a Distinguished Professor of Faith and Culture and the director of Intercultural and Indigenous Studies at George Fox University/ Portland Seminary. He is the author of the book, <u>Becoming Rooted</u>, which many of you have read. Randy and Edith have become recognized elders/wisdom-keepers in their community; having raised a family strong in their Indigenous traditions and practices.

The following is a quote from the farm's website: "Healing herbs and plants are tried and true ways of Indigenous peoples for thousands of years. At *Eloheh* we grow **healing herbs and plants** and **native wild-growns** throughout the property for our own use and to share with others as appropriate. We think of our living products as a vital part of the medicine gift from the plants. *Eloheh Indigenous Center for Earth Justice* focuses on developing, implementing and teaching sustainable and regenerative earth practices."

Music Ministry

March will be a magnificent month for music at First Presbyterian. The Chancel Choir will be joining several of the worship services because of Holy Week and Easter celebrations. They are preparing gorgeous anthems including one called "Were You There?" by Raymond Haan. This beautiful and different rendition of very familiar words will feature guest cellist, Nate Nauman, a freshman at George Fox University. Composer Raymond H. Haan, originally from Michigan (b. 1938), is a graduate of Calvin College and the University of Michigan. Haan was Director of Music at Cutlerville East Christian Reformed Church for more than fifty years. As a composer he has published extensively, and his body of more than 500 works includes music for organ, choir, handbells, and other solo instruments. This anthem will be sung at the Good Friday service, March 29th, at 7 pm. I hope you will enjoy the various moods, words, and arrangements of our Palm Sunday and Easter anthems. They are joyous, uplifting, musical, and inspiring.

The bell choir will play on March 17th and various bells will be joining in hymns and service music for Good Friday and Easter. And the Praise Team will play for worship on March 10th.

Here's a plea to our volunteer church musicians. There are opportunities to play for worship in April and May. Introits, centering reflections, (formerly the offertory) and postlude spots are available. Please contact Marcia to offer your skills and schedule a convenient date.


Presbyterian Women- New Leadership or Disband?

From Art to Action

As you view Margaret Godfrey's exhibition "Educate the Girls of the World," currently hanging in the Narthex Gallery, you'll see a moving blend of artistic expression and social content. Margaret will address both in her artist presentation on Sunday, March 10, 11:30-1:00, in the Whitman Room. You won't want to miss this.

Margaret's powerful exhibition meshes well with FPC's long-standing partnership with Friends of the Presbyterian Education Board (PEB) of Pakistan. PEB educates 5,700 Christian and Muslim students (60% of them girls) at its twenty-five schools in the Punjab region of Pakistan. For cultural reasons, girls face special challenges in pursuing their educational goals. Many are simply kept home for security reasons.

The combination of economics and culture dictate that attending school depends equally on the support of nurturing, professional teachers and financial assistance. Thus, a part of FPC's annual contribution to PEB provides a student scholarship, this year awarded to Jessica Qummer, daughter of a laborer and housewife, who dreams of becoming a doctor. Scholarships are \$400 for a full academic year.

The Mission Team will pool funds received and forward them to PEB, restricted for additional scholarships for girls. Inspired by art, we are moved to action.




