Upon Further Reflection

I'm Doing Leadership Mac!

A ministry colleague of mine, Beto Reyes from Praise Assembly, completed the Leadership McMinnville program through the Chamber of Commerce three years ago. This program aims to develop leaders in the city and expose them to essential aspects of city life that they may not already be familiar with. Beto loved the program, is now part of the advisory team, and he encouraged me to participate as well. After gaining the support of the congregation's Personnel Committee and the session, I am very glad to be part of this year's Leadership Mac cohort. Participation means I will go one day each month with a diverse cohort of 28 professionals to explore a different aspect of civic life in our wonderful community. The topics include:

Our first gathering was on Wed., March 13th. The group got to know each other through a wide variety of ice breakers. One exercise required us to move to one side of the room if we agreed with a certain statement, and the other side if we disagreed. The statements ranged from quirky ("I have never left the Pacific Northwest") to personally significant ("Someone close to me is fighting a life threatening illness"). For most questions there were some people on one side of the room, some on the other, and some who landed in the middle. But the last question had everyone in agreement: "I want what is best for our city." It was inspiring to see people from so many different cultural, political, professional, and educational backgrounds united in support of bettering our community.

The second half of the day was spent at the challenge course at Camp Tillicum. After lunch and some team building exercises, we moved on to the high ropes course. I fell off the log from 30 feet in the air! Fortunately, I was fully strapped in and there were so many people on the ropes, I didn't even fall one inch. That's power of community support.

My prayer is that God will use this experience to open up new opportunities for us to collaborate with others in the city to serve together and discern where the Spirit is at work in our community. Each month I'll share a little something with you that I have learned, but please ask me if you're interested in more details, or have insights of your own that might enrich the experience.

Orientation and introductions begin at 10:00am. Participants will be able to choose between removing invasive blackberries, planting plants along Cozine Creek, or weeding and assisting with


maintenance projects in the Linfield Community Garden. Overflow parking is available across campus. Please dress for the weather!


