#### **Upon Further Reflection**

#### What's Your Top 3?

One of our family practices at the end of each year is to go around the dinner table as each person names their "Top 3" moments from the previous year. There are the predictable responses of vacations, video games, and birthdays, but sometimes we hear a surprise: a long worked for achievement, time together when things were difficult, the opportunity to help someone in need. I like to seek out a favorite event which was loved by everyone in the family, but which nobody had yet remembered. These mentions get a big response, "Oh, yeah!"

As we go through our top moments in a year, we are practicing gratitude. This is an enjoyable tradition once a year, but it can become a truly powerful practice if we can make it part of our regular way of life.

Gratitude is so powerful that people who have high levels of gratitude are less likely to feel lonely. One recent study found that, "If someone was above average in gratitude, they had a 62% chance of being below average in loneliness." You can read an article about this study here:

What's the connection between gratitude and loneliness? When we take time to notice things we are grateful for, we also notice the people who care for us, encourage us, offer to help, share in the ups and downs of life with us, and make us smile. The more specific we can be with our gratitude, the more likely we are to notice that we do not go through life alone. I would add that when we notice things to be grateful for we also recognize the loving care and abiding presence of our Creator and Savior.

In a few days we will wrap up the year 2024 and step into 2025. It's a great opportunity for us to share your personal "Top 3" moments around a table of friends or family. But why should we only do this one time per year? I'm asking God to help me make a regular practice of noticing things I'm grateful for in everyday life. Gratitude is powerful – especially when we face times that are difficult.

Let them give thanks to the LORD for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for humankind, for he satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things. Psalm 107:8-9




